

Qualification Self-Checklist for Prospective Applicants for Fellow Status

This checklist helps the Fellow applicant determine whether he or she meets basic requirements for Fellow status in the American Psychological Association. Applicants should complete this form and include it with their Fellow Application.

The following questions may help you determine whether you meet the minimum qualifications:

(circle the appropriate answer)

YES NO Did you earn a doctoral degree based in part on a psychological dissertation, or from a program primarily psychological in nature and conferred by a graduate school of accredited standing?

YES NO Have you been an APA member and a member of your sponsoring division for at least one year?

YES NO Do you have at least five years of professional experience after receiving the doctoral degree?

YES NO Are you currently active in the advancement of psychology?

YES NO Can you present evidence of unusual and outstanding contributions or performances that have had a national or international impact in the field of psychology?

(e.g. strong impact of publications on a particular field of psychology, strong impact through community service, documented innovations, work that has been cited by others, presentation of papers, chairing symposia, conducting workshops, holding office in psychological organizations, influencing legislation or receiving awards or grants)

YES NO Can you name at least three APA Fellows who are familiar with your work and will sponsor your application by writing a supportive statement that attests specifically to your significant contributions to psychology?

YES NO Can you write a convincing statement that identifies your significant contributions to psychology in general and to your specific field in particular?
